During the explanation of a new topic to the student, new words and expressions, additional information, questions, and expressions familiar to the student are identified, that is, the analysis of the whole text is carried out on the basis of the "insert method". Clustering explanation of the same topic with a broader definition is called "cluster method". If question-and-answer games are organized on the topic, it is recommended to use the "brainstorm" method. This method will have the following structure:

a problem question is asked > thoughts and ideas are expressed and summarized > thoughts and ideas are grouped > fnic and correct answers are selected.

Asking questions about the topic, listening to the opinion of each student and drawing a conclusion is carried out through the "discussion-discussion" method. In addition, it is possible to perform the topic as a dialogue in roles, and to use the methods of competition and working in pairs. Recommended for use in the course of the lesson, it is desirable to be focused on practical exercises that develop speech, expand the mind and are rich in many necessary information, easy to master.

It should also be noted that the use of social media is also becoming widespread in the current era of rapid technology development. The potential and characteristics of using social media are primarily related to their access and speed of information, and their use for educational purposes allows classes to be held outside the classroom, which additionally motivates students.
